Safe Environment

For the safety of our children, all volunteers, including parents, are required to complete an on-line certification entitled “Safe and Sacred.” You can access it by visiting www.vermontcatholic.org.

There is a link to the program under Child Safety. Just a note, you will be required to do a background check as part of the certification. Completion of this is in accordance with Diocesan policies and is required for



anyone who wishes to work with our students in any capacity. Fingerprinting, however, is not necessary for this background check.

It may take a few weeks for you to receive a certificate of

completion due to the large number of volunteers in all our schools completing the program.

Safe and Sacred is a yearly program, so please keep your certificates up to date.

If you should have any questions, please contact Mrs. Gilarde in the office, who is our Safe Environment coordinator. There is no cost for any part of this program.

Together we can improve our children’s academic development and the communication between our school and your home.

Peanut Safe

We have students at Sacred Heart St. Francis School who have life threatening allergies to nuts, especially peanuts. We are asking that you work with us to make Sacred Heart St. Francis a [peanut safe school](#) by refraining from sending your children with peanut butter or other products containing nuts or nut oils (i.e. nutella). If these students come into contact with anything containing nuts, nut oils or

derivatives, it could be life threatening.

It is only necessary that physical contact with these substances be made, even on a second hand basis. For example, a severe reaction may occur should the child touch a desk, toy or book previously handled by another student who has touched peanut butter, peanuts or peanut oil. If you do send any treats into the school to be



shared, keep this in mind. Thank you for your support, understanding, and cooperation with this serious matter.

After School Program

Our After School Enrichment program, under the direction of Mrs. Nancy Hopkins and assisted by Ms. Chelsea Tiff, will begin on Tuesday, September 5. In order to cover all our expenses, the cost this year will be \$10.00 per day per student for the entire time or \$5.00 for the first hour. The program will run from 2:45 PM until 5:05 PM every full school day.

There will be an opportunity for

homework assistance Monday through Thursday and special activities are planned for the children as well. This is an important service we can provide for our families. Mrs. Becky Greenslet will be our homework club teacher again this year.

Sign-up sheets need to be filled out weekly. Please note that [payment must be received in advance](#) for the

days your child will be attending. If you should have questions about our ASEP, please call the main office. An After School Handbook is available on-line or you may request a hard copy. Registration packets are available online and at Open House. These must be on file with Mrs. Hopkins in order to attend the program.


