Open House and Picnic

Opening Day—September 2

The first official day of school for Sacred Heart St. Francis is Wednesday, September 2 Students in Grades 1-8 will line up in the paved parking lot according to grade level at the 8:15 AM bell. Following the second bell students will proceed to their classrooms. Morning Prayer this year will remain at 9 AM <u>after first period class</u>.

Preschool and Kindergarten parents are welcome to accompany their children to their classrooms beginning at 8:10 AM.

Safe Environment

For the safety of our children, all new volunteers including parents are required to comply with the school's request for a Vulnerable Record Check. This is in accordance with Diocesan policies and is required for anyone who wishes to work with our students in any capacity. Fingerprinting is not necessary for this background check.

In addition, all staff members, coaches, and volunteers (new and

old) who work directly with children (including field trip chaperones, lunch room helpers, etc.) must complete a new on-line program called "Safe and Sacred. "More information will be sent home next week about how to register.

The "Shield the Vulnerable" program previously used, as well as the "Virtus" program are no longer valid.

Peanut Safe

We have students at Sacred Heart St. Francis School who have life threatening allergies to nuts, especially peanuts. We are asking that you work with us to make Sacred Heart St. Francis <u>a peanut safe</u> <u>school</u> by refraining from sending your children with peanut butter or other products containing nuts or nut oils (i.e. nutella). If these students come into contact with anything containing nuts, nut oils or derivatives, it could be life threatening.

It is only necessary that physical contact with these substances be made, even on a second hand basis. For example, a severe reaction may occur should the child touch a desk, toy or book previously handled by another student who has touched peanut butter, peanuts or peanut oil. If you do send any treats into the school to be shared, keep this is mind. Thank you for your support, understanding, and cooperation with this serious matter.

School Lunches

Abbey Food Service will be providing our school lunches this year. The cost will now be \$2.25 per day or \$11.25 for a five-day week. Meals will be sold the first day of each week for the whole week or specific days. Daily lunch will be sold in the event of an emergency situation. A menu is sent home at the beginning of each month.

Snack Milk

If your child would like to purchase milk for <u>snack</u>, the cost is \$2.50 for a five-day week or 50 cents per day.

Milk must be prepaid on Thursdays so that we may place our order ahead of time.

First Week

School lunches will available Wednesday, September 2, the first day of school. The cost for lunches for the week of September 2 will be \$6.75.

Renweb

What is it? What does it do?

Our school uses a web-based school administration system called RenWeb to enhance communication among teachers, parents, and students.

RenWeb is a fully integrated web-based school information system, and RenWeb can be accessed 24/7, from work, home, school or on the road. Parents and students will utilize a component of RenWeb which is called Parents Web. The Parents Web component of RenWeb provides parents and students passwordsecure access to SHSF student information such as:

• Attendance • Daily Grades • Progress Reports • Report Cards • Lesson Plans • Homework • Missing Assignments • Staff & School Directory • Behavior Logs • Teacher Email Addresses • Teacher Websites
