## TUITION ASSISTANCE

Each year the Applications for tuition assistance are due to FACTS. This year's date is March 31. Please get your forms in on time.

Tuition assistance amounts will be announced in April and each family applying for assistance will receive a letter announcing their scholarship amount. FACTS has a toll free number if you need help filling out your application. You must file on-line this year. Paper applications are no longer available. Directions are

included in this week's email.

Next year's tuition rate has been set. Tuition for the first child in the family will be \$4995. Tuition for the second will be \$4795 and tuition for the third will be \$4595. This represents a modest 3% increase.

Families who believe they need financial aid are encouraged to take advantage of the assistance that is being offered. Grant and Aid applications assure fairness to all our families.

## SAFE ENVIRONMENT

All volunteers, including parents, are required to comply with the school's request for a Vulnerable Record Check for the safety of our children. This is in accordance with Diocesan policies and is required for anyone who wishes to work with our students in any capacity. Fingerprinting is not necessary for this background check.

In addition, all staff members, coaches, and volunteers (new and old) who work directly with children (including field trip chaperones,

lunch room helpers, etc.) must complete a new on-line program called "VIRTUS." If your "Safe and Sacred" certificate has expired, you will need to complete the new program right away and all others need to have it done before they can volunteer or be a chaperone for events.

The "Safe and Sacred" program previously used will no longer be accessible or valid.

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## FROM THE PRINCIPAL



Students who recognize their personal learning style and use strategies appropriate to that style become successful learners. At school, we try to help each student become aware of what makes learning easier for him or her. Through observation, talking with your child, and trying some simple experiments, you can help identify his or her personal learning style.

Knowing whether sight, hearing, or touch is the dominant sense is important. Try saying a series of ten numbers aloud and see how many the child can recall. Let the child see another set of numbers and try to recall them without looking back. Then let him or her copy a few simple designs and try to redraw them from memory. Try similar experiments with words and pictures. You may discover that your child is a visual learner, an auditory learner, a kinesthetic learner, or a combination of two types.

In the classroom, we try to teach in a way that will consider each student's dominant sense. Some children may learn easily from pictures, maps, charts, or graphs while others may need to hear an oral explanation of what they are seeing. Still others need to be doing something involving movement as they learn (perhaps making their own map, graph, or illustration).

Environmental factors such as light, sound, and temperature affect ability to learn. Subjects taught in an individual's peak performance time may seem easier because of that reason. A child's maturity, motivation, and sense of responsibility affect his or her approach to learning.

Helping your child find out what works best is certainly a worthwhile goal for you, and the student who learns to "work smarter, not harder" is likely to be a successful student.
