Overview of Program for

Pre-Kindergarten

I. Social and Emotional Development

- Providing opportunities during 'free play' to make choices
- Providing opportunities to work and play cooperatively
- Providing opportunities for problem solving
- Discussing the topics of feelings of respect for others and for classroom materials, class rules and responsibilities
- Learning to solve conflicts with others
- Developing imagination through play-puppets and dress-up
- Providing, always, opportunities to receive love and respect from caring adults

II. Intellectual Development

- Providing varied labels, charts, and books to associate speech with print
- Scheduling story time
- Using activities or discussion for recalling details, making predictions, making comparisons and drawing conclusions
- Using listening games for sound identification
- Sequencing story parts
- Dictating original stories to adults
- Sharing items with beginning alphabet sounds
- Counting activities and games
- Discussing daily calendar and seasonal topics
- Experiencing tactile games
- Using of left to right progression
- Playing with water
- Graphing
- Patterning
- Enjoying magnets, caterpillars, insects, leaves and other natural materials

III. Aesthetic Development

- Using of crayons, markers, tape, glue, chalk, paints and play-doh
- Introducing nicely illustrated picture books
- Creating group murals
- Using of rhythm instruments, records and tape cassettes for enjoyment and creative movement
- Singing in the classroom and in school musicals

IV. Physical Development

- Climbing up and down the stairs
- Circling games in a group
- Playing with balls and bean bags
- Using balancing games
- Using beads for stringing, hammer and nails, pegboards, play-doh, pencils, crayons, markers, glue, scissors, puzzles, construction toys, blocks and other materials to enhance fine motor development
- Recognizing and discussing health hazards such as poor nutrition and seat belt safety

V. Spiritual Development

- Reciting opening prayer and grace at snack time
- Observing nature as God's creation (shells, rocks, leaves, butterfly life cycle)
- Holding group discussions
- Using sequential lessons from <u>Come Follow Me</u>, (a religion readiness program)
