Lent

Each year, the church sets aside 40 days as a special time we call LENT. This year's Lenten season began last week on Ash Wednesday, February 22nd.

As a school, we will be doing the Stations of the Cross on Fridays during Lent either following Mass at church or in the afternoons at school. There will be a Family Stations of the Cross on Friday, March 24th at 5:30pm at Sacred Heart St. Francis de Sales.



Each child has received a packet of Lenten goodies to share with their families. The packet will include a 'Gathering Around the Cross' activity book and Lenten boxes to help support Operation Rice Bowl. The readings from the 'Gathering Around the Cross' booklet will be incorporated into morning prayer. Please reinforce the importance of sacrificing for others with your children during this time. It is important for us to journey together and remember all the sacrifices Jesus made for all of us. The 'rice bowls' will be collected during Holy Week. You can return them to the parish or school office.

Tuition Assistance for the '22-23 School Year
