Each year, the church sets aside 40 days as a special time we call LENT. This year's Lenten season begins on Ash Wednesday, tomorrow, March 2nd. Students will be receiving ashes during our Ash Wednesday service that will be in place of Morning Prayer on Wednesday.

Stations of the Cross will take place on Fridays during lent (March 4th, 11th, 18th, and April 1st) at St. John the Baptist Church in North Bennington. There will be a Family Stations of the Cross on Friday, April 8th at 5:30pm at Sacred Heart St. Francis de Sales.

Each child will receive a packet of Lenten goodies to share with their families. The packet will include a 'Peeking Through the Palms' activity book and Lenten boxes to help support Operation Rice Bowl. Please reinforce the importance of sacrificing for others with your children during this time. It is important for us to journey together and remember all the sacrifices Jesus made for all of us. The boxes will be collected during Holy Week.

Tuition Assistance for the 2022-2023 School Year

Tuition assistance applications will be done online this year. You may begin the application process **today**—March 1st! Families who are currently enrolled and seeking tuition assistance must have this application done by March 31st, 2022.

If you are seeking assistance, please keep in mind:

- You must file these forms by the stated due date.
- Scholarship amounts will be announced in April and each family applying for assistance will receive a letter announcing the amount of assistance our school is able to offer.
- FACTS has a toll free number if you need help filling out your application.
