SUMMER UNIFORM — LAST DAY—

Friday, October 1st will be the last day for the summer uniform. Starting Tuesday, October 5th, students will no longer be allowed to wear the green polos, skorts or shorts.

If students are not in correct uniform, the following will occur:

Strike 1: Out of uniform notice sent home and must be returned, signed by a parent/guardian.

Strike 2: Out of uniform notice sent home and 20 minutes of school service time granted.

Strike 3+: Out of uniform notice and parent/ guardian will be called/notified. Parent must bring correct uniform needs and/or pick up student until uniform is corrected.
