# SCHOOL SUPPLY LISTS BY GRADE LEVEL

## Pre-K with Mrs. Becker Supply

List: 2 large container disinfecting wipes; 2 packages 5oz. cups; 1 roll of paper towels; 1 box of tissues; 1 package of thin Crayola magic markers, 1 package thin dry erase markers, 1 package thin highlighters, 2 reams of copy paper

New Families--1 complete set of extra clothes in a 6 quart plastic box with lid (does not need to be a complete uniform); If your child is staying for nap time, 1 crib size sheet and small blanket in a 12 quart plastic box with lid

Returning Families--1 complete set of extra clothes (does not need to be a uniform); If your child is staying for nap time, 1 crib size sheet and small blanket.

## Kindergarten with Mr. B Supply

List: 9 boxes (8 count regular size box) Crayola crayons; 3 large glue sticks; 1 box 12 count Ticonderoga beginner pencils (they are larger than regular size pencils), 3 reams of copy paper, 4 rolls of paper towels, 2 large boxes of tissues, 2 large containers of disinfecting wipes, 2 bottles of hand sanitizer, 1 package of low odor dry erase markers, 1 set of headphones for technology, 2- two pocket folders any color (they must have two pockets and no holes in the center for hole punching).

## First Grade with Ms. Barry

Supply List: Please label items/packages with student's name--  
1 large glue stick; 1 pkg. eraser caps; 1 box of Crayola crayons (24 count not the twist type); 1 pencil sharpener (with shaving cap cover); 1 highlighter; 4 low odor DRY erase markers; 12 yellow Ticonderoga pencils sharpened; 1 sock or mitten for erasing boards; 1 pencil box ; 1-1 subject notebook; 1 MEAD primary journal (Grade K-2 found at Walmart or Staples); 2 Folders- One labeled for Homework and one for Classwork; 1 reusable water bottle; headphones.

## Second Grade with Ms.

LaPorte Supply List: Labeled Supplies: 1 large eraser (not pencil toppers), 1 pencil sharpener w/shaving cap cover; 1 box 24 count Crayola crayons (not twist up); 5 pocket folders in the following colors: RED for Reading, BLUE for Religion, YELLOW for Writing, GREEN for Homework, ORANGE for Math; 1 plastic folder with fasteners of any color; 1 K-2 Primary Journal found at Wal-Mart or Staples; 1 pencil box, 1 reusable water bottle

Unlabeled Supplies: 24 yellow #2 pencils sharpened; 2 reams of copy paper; 1 large box of tissues; 4 large rolls of paper towels; 2 containers of sanitizing wipes, 2 whiteboard markers, 2 packs of 3x5 index cards

## Third Grade with Mrs. Greens-

let Supply List: Please bring all of your school supplies to school on the first day. We will organize and label the supplies together in class. 1 Zip Loc GALLON bag with student's name on it, 10-12 pencils; 10-12 eraser caps, 1 large eraser; 1 personal pencil sharpener; 8x5 inches (the bigger ones don't fit in the desk), 1 box of 24 CRAYOLA crayons (not the twist type crayons); 1 pkg. of 12 CRAYOLA colored pencils; 8 pocket folders (bottom pocket style) in the following colors: red, orange, blue, purple, green and 2 of choice; 1 yellow highlighter; 1 highlighter -- any other color; 4-6 low odor dry erase markers (any colors except neon or tropical); 4-6 large glue sticks; 2 Jumbo size Book Sox fabric book covers; 1 pkg. multiplication flash cards; 2 pkgs. 2 - 2 1/2 inch letters -- any color (not 4 inch); 2 large white poster boards (approx. 28 X 22 inches); 1 INEXPENSIVE calculator; 2 medium size binder clips; 1 bottle of personal hand sanitizer; 2 rolls of paper towels; 2 boxes of tissues; 2 reams of white copy paper, 2 containers of sanitizing wipes. \*\*Please don't buy larger amounts of colored pencils or crayons. We have many supplies, textbooks and folders, so the extra amounts don't fit inside the desk. The extra colored pencils and crayons will be sent home. Students DO NOT need to bring rulers, scissors, markers or binders.

## Fourth Grade with Mrs. Gorry

Supply List: 2 One-subject spiral notebooks (for Writing and Math Journals); 6 folders (bottom pocket style) in different colors (for each subject); 1 Homework folder (any design of your choice); 1 - 24 count box of #2 pencils; 1 personal pencil sharpener; 1 package pencil top erasers; 1 box 24-count crayons; 1 box colored pencils; 1 pair of scissors; 3 glue sticks; 1 zippered pencil box or large pouch; 3 highlighters (any color); 2 low odor dry erase markers (any color); 2 Jumbo sized book covers (Book Sox); 2 boxes of tissues; 2 rolls of paper towels; 2 containers of anti-bacterial wipes; 1 bottle of hand sanitizer; 2 reams copier paper; Note: An assignment notebook (planner) will be provided.

## Middle School (Grades 5-8)

Supply List: 6 (1 inch) ring binders; 10 #2 pencils; 4 pkgs. 8-subject index dividers (1 for each binder); 1 pkg. Crayola wide markers; 1 pkg. Crayola thin tip markers; 3 highlighters (different colors); 1 hand-held pencil sharpener; 1 ruler; 1 pair of scissors; 2 pkg. notebook filler paper; 2 hard covered composition books; a few pencil cap erasers; 2 low odor dry erase markers; a Texas Instrument 30-X A calculator (\$10 at Wal-Mart)-If you already have one, please be sure it still works; 2 glue sticks; 3 rolls of paper towels; 1 large box of tissues; 2 reams of white copy paper; 2 container of sanitizing wipes.
