School Uniform Update

There is a slight change to our uniform for the upcoming 2022-2023 school year. This year, students will be allowed to wear a uniform green polo year-round. The only time the students will **not** be allowed to wear a green polo will be on days when we attend Mass, such as our weekly school mass, or other special events. These days will be communicated with students at school and with families in weekly updates and newsletters throughout the year. Khaki shorts and/or

skirts will still only be considered “warm weather” uniform. Khaki pants are appropriate year-round.

I would also like to share a couple reminders to all families regarding our uniform policy. Our uniform shows the pride we take in ourselves and our school.

- It is important that clothing is clean.
- **Only** white, black, and navy blue socks are permitted and should be worn at all times.
- Hair must be a natu-

ral color, and regardless of length, it must be out of the student’s face.

- Boots, Crocs, sandals, or other shoes without a back are not permitted.
- Even if awarded a “no-uniform day”, students must follow the dress code outlined in the handbook.
- No smart watches permitted.

Parents will be notified if a student is out of uniform and may be asked to bring what is needed.

The green polos that have been previously worn are still allowed.

Supply Lists by Grade Level

Please bring supplies to Open House or on the first day of school.

Pre-K 3 & 4

All Families:

- 2 large containers disinfecting wipes
- 2 packages 5oz. cups
- 2 rolls of paper towels
- 2 boxes of tissue
- 1 package thick Crayola magic markers
- 5 boxes of Crayola 8 count crayons
- 2 reams of copy paper

New Families:

- 1 complete set of extra clothes in a 6 quart plastic box with lid (does not need to be a complete uniform)
- If your child is staying for nap time, 1 crib size sheet and small blanket in a 12 quart plastic box with lid

Returning Families:

- 1 complete set of extra clothes (does not need to be a uniform)
- If your child is staying for nap time, 1 crib size sheet and small blanket

Kindergarten

- 9 boxes (8 count regular size box) Crayola crayons
- 5 glue sticks
- 1 box 12 count Ticonderoga beginner pencils (they are larger than regular size pencils)
- 2 reams of copy paper
- 3 rolls of paper towels
- 3 large containers of disinfecting wipes
- 1 package of low odor dry erase markers
- 1 set of headphones
- 2- two pocket folders any color
- 1 package of 3x5 index cards (100 count).

First Grade

Please label items/packages with student's name:

- 1 large glue stick
- 1 pkg. eraser caps
- 1 box of Crayola crayons (24 count) (not the twist type)
- 1 pencil sharpener (with shaving cap cover)
- 1 highlighter
- 4 low odor DRY erase markers
- 12 yellow Ticonderoga pencils-sharpened

boards
